

Agatha Christie's And Then There Were None has always been a favorite of mine. Ten rather wicked strangers are taken care of one by one, all to the prescriptions of an innocent children's nursery rhyme. The manner of which has now been done to death in various stage plays and films that mostly fall quite shy of this original idea. Although some may consider the writing of Christie trite and some implausible, she was the first recipient of the Mystery Writers of America's highest honor, the Grand Master Award and who's company includes writing greats John Dickson Carr, Mary Higgins Clark, Graham Greene, P.D. James, Stephen King, and Rex Stout.


Gordon in Voices In The Void. The judge in CCT production of Miracle on 34th Street, Juror #6 in Annex Theater Twelve Angry Men.


