DIRECTOR'S NOTES

If your family is as busy as mine this time of the year, it can be very difficult to keep the meaning of this season in mind, what with all of the shopping, planning, special events, hustle and bustle. So let me thank you for taking some time to join us as we retell the original story that Charles Dickens wrote over 160 years ago. As I was preparing for this production I revisited the original text (even images of Mr. Dickens' own hand written pages). As I was reading the text, his preface did a great job of summing up his purpose for writing the story, and thus the reason why we love this story so much.

In the original preface he writes (see his hand written copy):



I have endeavoured in this Ghostly little book, to raise the Ghost of an Idea, which shall not put my readers out of humour with themselves, with each other, with the season, or with me. May it haunt their houses pleasantly, and no one wish to lay it. Their faithful Friend and Servant, C. D., December, 1843.

So, if I may borrow from the words of Charles Dickens, I hope this story and the lessons it reminds us of "haunt your house pleasantly" this season and for the rest of our lives.


