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
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
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

Director's Notes

My Fair Lady is on the StageCoach Players stage for the first time! The musical first opened on Broadway in 1956. At that time it was the longest running musical with a total of 2,717 performances. The show starred a young Julie Andrews and Rex Harrison. For the 1965 film, the part of Eliza was recast with Audrey Hepburn and Rex Harrison again playing Henry Higgins. One of the many controversies at the time was that Ms. Hepburn was not allowed to sing the majority of Eliza's songs. She was forced to lip sync to other ladies singing her songs! The only song she was allowed to sing in her own voice was "Just You Wait".

The story of My Fair Lady is based on the 1913 play, Pygmalion, written by George Bernard Shaw. George Pascal's film premiered in 1938 starring Leslie Howard and Wendy Hiller. Pygmalion and My Fair Lady storylines are nearly identical, with the exception of the wonderful music added to the film and stage production. I really prefer the black and white 1938 film to the 1965 film. My personal reason is that the main characters were more endearing. The best thing about the 1965 show is definitely the addition of the wonderful music score. Alfred P. Doolittle's "With a Little Bit of Luck" and "Get Me to the Church on Time", Eliza Doolittle's "Wouldn't it Be Loverly" and "I Could Have Danced all Night", Freddy Hill's "On the Street Where You Live", and of course, Henry Higgins "I've Grown Accustomed To Her Face.

Two more controversies were also associated with the 1956 musical and 1965 film. First was the ending of the play. The 1913 play ends with Eliza walking out on Higgins. The writers wanted a happier ending for Broadway, but disagreed on how the story should end. Should Eliza run off to marry Freddy Hill or should she go back to Henry Higgins? Personally, I never felt there was much of a chemistry between Eliza and Higgins in the movie. Ironically enough, I felt that Higgins and Col. Pickering did have the chemistry! I don't want to give it away, so I won't tell you the ending. The other controversy was the use of the British curse word "bloody" on stage. My goodness how things have changed, and yet, how they have stayed the same!!

I hope you enjoy the show!
