

Director's Notes

I don't recall ever having directed a play that has inspired so many people to tell me how much they were looking forward to seeing it onstage.

I might have thought some of them remembered the 1968 movie, starring Peter O'Toole, who won a Golden Globe for his performance as Henry II, and Katharine Hepburn, who won the Oscar for best actress that year, as Eleanor of Aquitaine. However, many people who have approached me weren't even born until after this movie was released.

Even in the rehearsal process, the question that began, "Whatever happened to..." came up quite often amongst our cast and crew.

The Lion in Winter is a fictional account of one Christmas holiday during the latter years of the reign of King Henry II of England. Though not accurate in a true historical sense, this event never actually took place, I was surprised to learn during my research on the time period in which this play is set that many of the author's depictions of the characters and their interactions in the play were very much based on the historical record of events leading up to the year 1183 (see Dramaturgical Notes elsewhere in this program).

So, what is it that is so compelling about this story?

I think the partial answer is that all of the characters in this play are depictions of real people. There is written history on every one of them. However, I think the remainder of the explanation of interest is the American fascination with all things related to English royalty, even if those royal figures weren't all that good at what they were supposed to do—some of them, including all three of Henry II of England's sons were terrible, if not horrible, as leaders. I don't get it, but the fascination is an undeniable fact, and I will leave it at that.


Dramaturgical Notes

"Henry Fitz-Empress, the first Plantagenet." Henry II was the son of the "Empress" Matilda (so-called because of her first marriage to the Holy Roman Emperor Henry V) and Geoffrey the Fair, Count of Anjou, Maine, & Touraine, who was also known as "Plantagenet" for the spring flower, planta genista, that he would wear in his cap. Matilda was the only surviving child of Henry I of England, and tried to claim the throne upon his death, only to see her cousin Stephen take it. Henry began leading troops into battle against King Stephen at age 14, and in 1153 forced a peace treaty naming Henry heir to the throne. Stephen died shortly thereafter, making Henry King of England, "Done at 21."

"He married, out of Love, a woman out of legend." Eleanor was the most desirable heiress in Europe after inheriting the Duchy of Aquitaine in her own right upon the death of her father, Duke William X. She was married at a young age to Prince Louis, who shortly became King Louis VII of France. After years of marriage, including participating in the disastrous Second Crusade, Eleanor had managed to only bear Louis two daughters, and created a certain amount of scandal at Court, so King Louis had their marriage annulled on the grounds of consanguinity. She almost immediately married then-Count Henry, and soon became Queen of England.

"The Young King died in summer, and I haven't named an heir." Queen Eleanor then proved quite prolific, and bore Henry five sons and three daughters. Their first son, William, died in infancy, but the second, young Henry, grew up and was crowned as co-monarch with his father. King Henry would never grant his son any real power, however, and Young Henry often revolted against his father. Eleanor supported her son in his rebellion of 1173, and when the elder Henry triumphed, he had her imprisoned in England for the rest of his life. In the summer of 1183, Young Henry was again in rebellion, but took ill, and when he realized he was dying, he begged for his father's forgiveness. He is said to have died clutching in his hand the ring that King Henry sent to him as a token of forgiveness.

This has set the stage for the events that are portrayed in *The Lion in Winter*. Although the events and intrigues of several years are compressed into one fictitious Christmas Court in Chinon, the play does present a reasonably plausible account of the relationships, conflicts, and struggles of this dysfunctional Royal Family.



Thank you for attending today's performance of *The Lion in Winter*. What a classic story director David Booth and his talented cast bring to our stage.

We have quite the ambitious schedule for the remaining months of 2013. In October we present *Rope*, directed by G. Scott Morris. There is plenty of intrigue in this show, and it formed the basis of the 1948 Alfred Hitchcock film. Set in London 1966, two undergraduates murder a fellow classmate. They place the body in a wooden chest, then invite a few acquaintances, including the dead youth's grandfather, to a party, the chest serving as a supper table. The horror and tension are worked up gradually as we see the guests leave, and view the reactions of the two murderers, watched by the suspecting Rupert Cadell."

November brings *Annie* directed by Sue Price Johnson. This favorite Broadway family musical is set in the depths of the 1930's. Annie is a young orphan girl who must live in a miserable orphanage run by Miss Hannigan. Her hopeless situation changes when she is selected to spend time at the residence of the wealthy Oliver Warbucks. He decides to help Annie find her long lost parents by offering a reward if they would come to him and prove their identity. However, Miss Hannigan and friends, plan to impersonate those people to get the reward for themselves.

Rounding out the year is our traditional presentation of Charles Dicken's *A Christmas Carol*. This year's adaption is by the director Amanda Smothers, who brings a fresh look at a classic holiday show. We do hope you will make plans to attend one of the 5 performances. As always, the Saturday matinee performance will be to benefit the Salvation Army Toys for Tots program.
