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

DIRECTORS NOTES

There is a simple fact that we've had to live with as we've rehearsed and staged *Play It Again, Sam*: Humphrey Bogart and Woody Allen are stage and screen icons, and they are both, and at once, hard to live up to and even harder to get away from. Their personalities, styles and mannerisms are indelibly imprinted within its pages, which stands as testament to Allen's quick-witted and compelling writing, and Bogie's status as the number one screen legend of all time.

What I eventually realized in my vision of these two icons coming to life onstage, is that we were stepping back into two layers of time and place, not just one, as a "normal" period piece would be. As Allen wrote this play in 1969, I found it mildly amusing that it is now considered a period piece at all – amusing, due in part to the realization that I have actually become this old, but also that the year 1969, was, well, only yesterday. In other words, I came from the first layer and remember it well – and yes, things are very, very different now.

Allen pulled the second layer from nearly thirty years before, when Bogart began his rise to leading man and screen legend status with his performance in 1941 as hardboiled detective Sam Spade, in *The Maltese Falcon*. For Allen, that time and place was very different. Sometimes unnervingly quaint in his depiction of male-female relationships, Allen managed to find humor in the Neanderthal throwback to when it was acceptable to the male-dominant population of the time to slap a woman around in order to make her behave. It offends me to even say it, until I relax into the historic connotation and simply get over the fact that life was different then, seventy years ago.

On the other hand, if anyone pulls a gun on you, perhaps a slap across the face in the name of self-defense can be forgiven. When you think about it, that ends up being pretty funny – as long as you have obtained the gun first. Heckuva way to end a first date...


