



Nearly twenty years ago along with my dad, I travelled to Chicago to watch a production of Night of the Living Dead that my brother Todd was in. It was a different script, but same story as the original 1968 film. It was an extremely entertaining play filled with as much humor as it was with horror and gore. The set, costumes, props and all technical aspects of the production were simple, played on a small stage and worked well like many plays done at small theatre companies in Chicago. So when the opportunity came to direct a staged version of one the most well-known horror films of all time here at Stage Coach, I jumped at the chance and then proceeded to make the production as complicated a project as I could. Those involved in this production have stepped up to bring all of the facets of this monster together. They improved on many of the ideas I shared, took on extra components within the production and incurred scratches, bruises and other maladies while shooting video near a quiet, old house near Lee, Illinois. We hope the hard work has culminated in an extremely entertaining evening for the audience, the actors and crew members alike.
